VIRTUAL AFTER SCHOOL PROGRAMS

From first through twelfth grade, our students pivoted from in-person after school programs to 100% virtual. Although the pandemic brought many technical challenges and uncertainties, it also gave Stars staff, volunteers, and families an opportunity to learn new virtual skills. It also created opportunities to engage with students and families in new ways through Zoom, consistent calling and texting, and safe in-person connections.

Thanks to volunteers and partner organizations, Stars students continued to learn social skills, stay connected to God's word, discover Space and Science with CalTech, practice reading with Reading Partners, prepare for College with College Access Plan (CAP), learn about self-care and mental health with Young and Healthy, create art with Armory Center for the Arts, learn guitar, get homework help, and much more.

Critical Thinking & Fun @ Stars 45

Eric and Whitney, the staff of Stars 45 (4th and 5th grade), share about a couple of their favorite virtual program times:

"Some of the most rewarding conversations were discussing relevant world events. The students were insightful and presented fresh ideas that sparked critical thinking!

We also enjoyed 'fun days' with the students. They taught us how to play Roblox, which consists of various games that can be played with friends and others around the world. The students got a kick out of the staff struggling to learn the game."



PARTNERSHIPS

One of Stars' core values is collaboration - seeking key partnerships to pursue the vision of a thriving interdependent community where lives are transformed.

In February, Stars convened several partners for the 2020 Community Summit to address education equity, specifically the math achievement gap. The school district did not have the capacity to provide timely credit recovery, and adults were often afraid to tutor students due to their own bad experiences with math. The training was led by STEMulate Learning, who specialize in removing stigmas and teaching math in a culturally relevant and accessible way

When COVID-19 hit in March 2020, Stars leveraged relationships with multiple organizations to set up meal deliveries for families who were unable to pick up meals from the PUSD distribution sites. This ultimately led to the delivery of 46,125 meals to PUSD families.

The success of these two endeavors has led the district to seek out Stars to provide collaborative solutions to other issues as well.




COLLEGE SUPPORT

The Covid-19 pandemic has presented various challenges to our Stars College students. However, Stars students' resiliency strengthened during this time and manifested itself in different ways.

Angelica is an example of the many college students who persevered and found ways to thrive in 2020. Before the pandemic, she was enrolled part-time at Pasadena City College due to her workload and finances. When she was awarded financial support through the Stars scholarship program she felt more comfortable increasing to 4 classes! We are thrilled she officially fulfilled all the necessary requirements to obtain her Associate's degree and transfer to a 4-year university. We are excited to continue to walk alongside her as she pursues her Bachelor's degree.

As I announce my completion of the CSU application, I am proud to say that you all made it possible. The support allowed me to think more deeply about my values and who I want to be. Now, I stand with my head up because I found inspiration and strength in my passions. It's pretty amazing, I have a whole foundation to remind me I have what it takes. As I continue steadily and intentionally achieving all my dreams, I want to remind you that the values I've acquired in the presence of Stars continue to inspire me to uplift others and strive to make a difference in our society. I dream of becoming an academic/career counselor in higher education. Acknowledging all the greatness in me, I am confident I will change the world."



MENTORING







Arlene's Testimony:

"Starting this mentoring journey during the pandemic felt uncertain and uneasy but right in every way. I knew the Lord would have his hand in this journey. I had a hard time imagining what it would be like to mentor without meeting in person, but early on I realized Leah is resilient and can adapt quickly. We have done many activities via zoom - like Art Tutorials with the Broad Museum, 10-minute crafts from YouTube, playing the AmongUs video game, watching the original Wonder Woman series and discussing their fun costumes and feminism, and lately doing fun projects with our Wreck this Journals where we each share our creative journal entries every session. Alternating between Leah and myself to come up with new project ideas was freeing and I learned that relinquishing control would be powerful and beautiful for both of us. I am the mentor, but Leah has taught me to pivot my perspective and dive into activities without hesitation. We have bonded through laughter, silence, frustration, insights, ah-ha moments and many times art provided relief in a busy week of expectation for both us. Being a mentor during this pandemic has been an unexpected blessing. I pray that others explore this way of serving."
